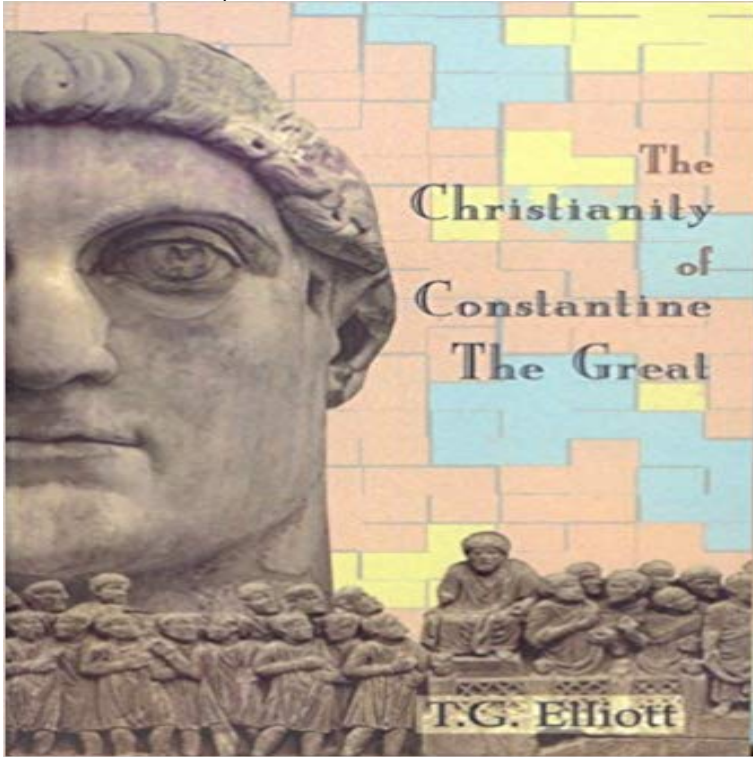


Christianity of Constantine the Great
