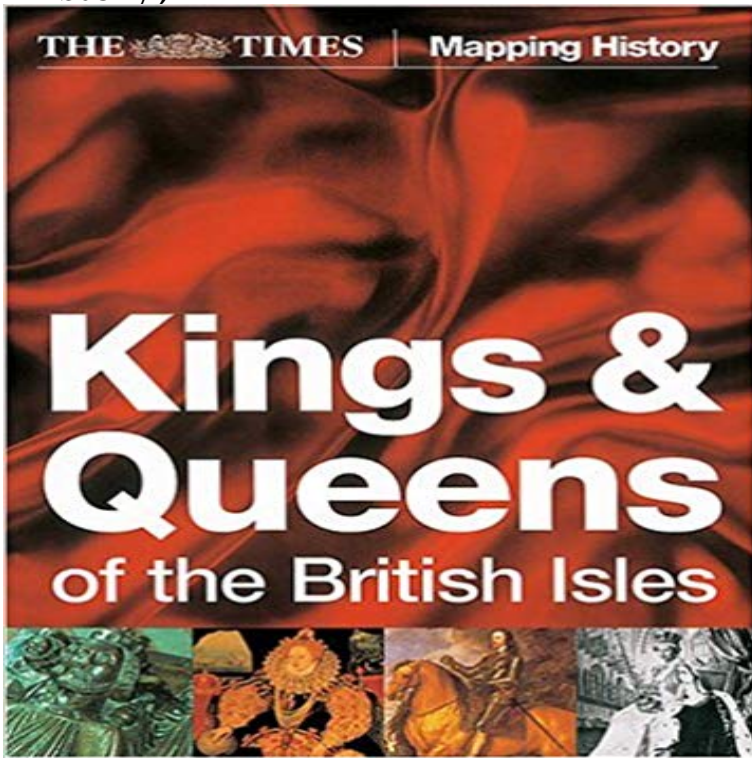


The Times Kings and Queens of the British Isles (Times Mapping History)
