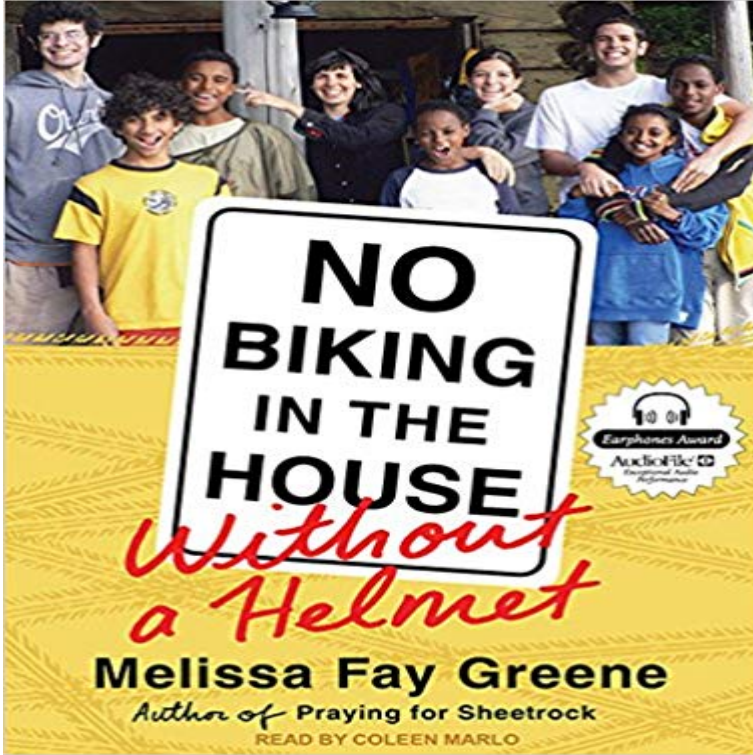


# No Biking in the House Without a Helmet



When the two-time National Book Award finalist Melissa Fay Greene confided to friends that she and her husband planned to adopt a four-year-old boy from Bulgaria to add to their four children at home, the news threatened to place her, she writes, among the greats: the Kennedys, the McCaughey septuplets, the von Trapp family singers, and perhaps even Mrs. Feodor Vassilyev, who, according to the Guinness Book of World Records, gave birth to sixty-nine children in eighteenth-century Russia. Greene is best known for her books on the civil rights movement and the African HIV/AIDS pandemic. But Melissa and her husband have also pursued a more private vocation: parenthood. When the number of children hit nine, Greene took a break from reporting. She trained her journalists eye upon events at home. Fisseha was riding a bike down the basement stairs; out on the porch, a squirrel was sitting on Jesses head; vulgar posters had erupted on bedroom walls; the insult niftam (the Amharic word for snot) had led to fistfights; and four non-native-English-speaking teenage boys were researching, on Moms computer, the subject of saxing. At first I thought one of our trombone players was considering a change of instrument, writes Greene. Then I remembered: they cant spell. Using the tools of her trade, she uncovered the true subject of the saxing investigation, inspiring the chapter Everything You Always Wanted to Know About Sex, but Couldnt Spell.
