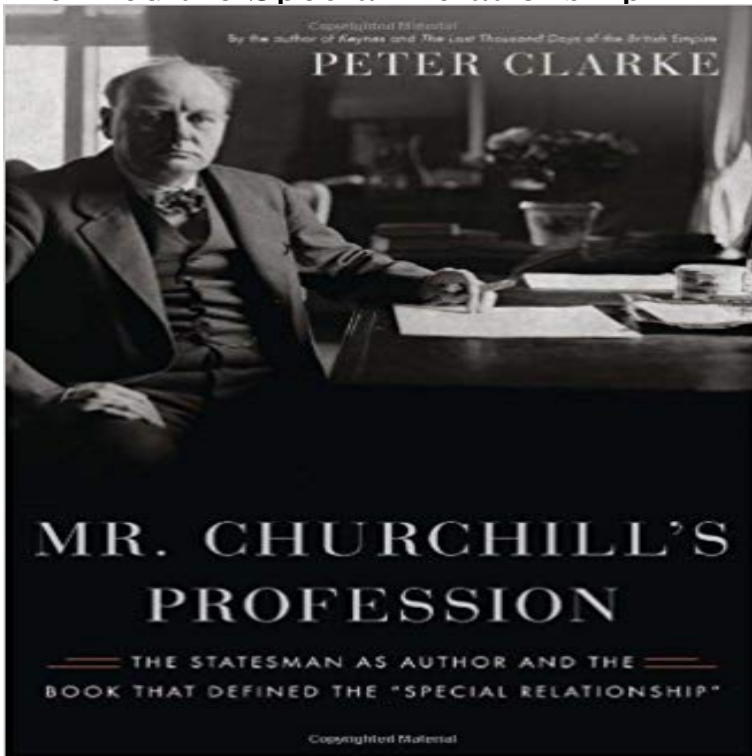


# Mr. Churchills Profession: The Statesman as Author and the Book That Defined the Special Relationship
