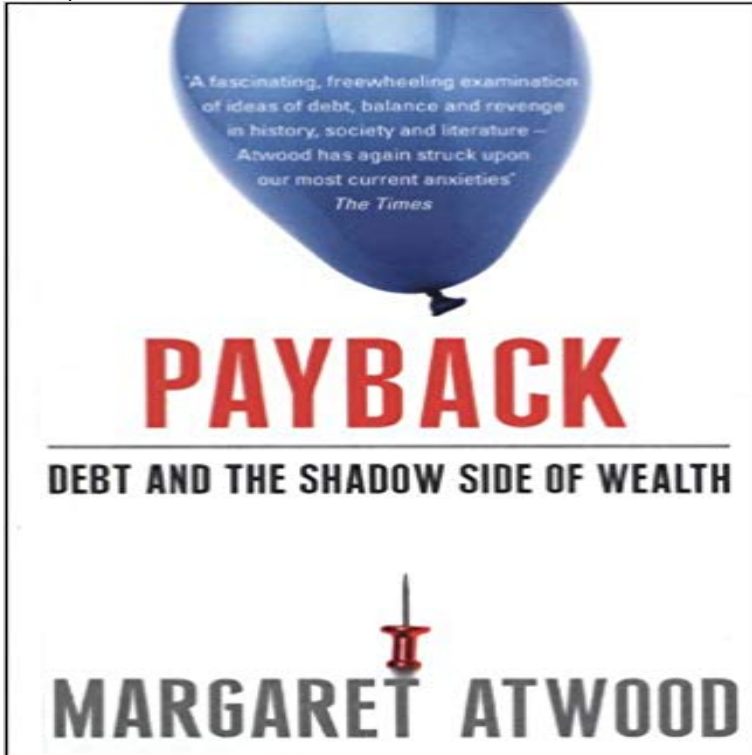


Payback: Debt and the Shadow Side of Wealth
