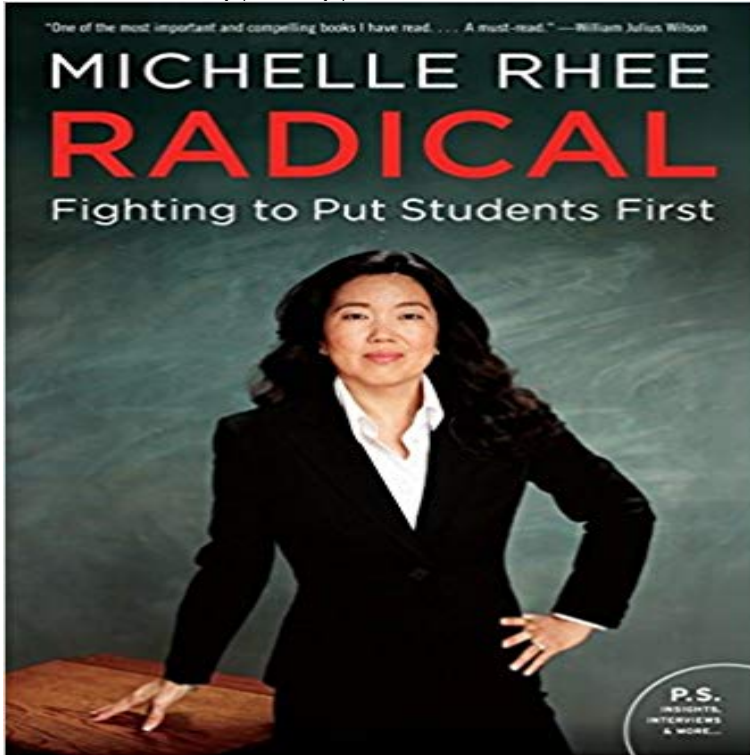


Radical: Fighting to Put Students First
